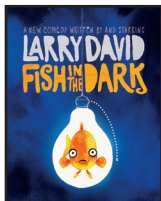

**Finding Neverland**

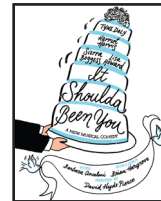
